Ex-basketball star Odom on life support

Former pro basketball player and reality TV star **Lamar Odom** was reportedly on life support for a second day Thursday after falling unconscious at a Nevada brothel, as friends and family rushed to his bedside and asked fans to pray for his recovery.

Odom, 35, the estranged husband of reality TV star **Khloe Kardashian**, on Tuesday was found unresponsive at Love Ranch, a legal brothel in Crystal, Nev., by employees who said he had used cocaine and a sexual performance-enhancing supplement, according to the Nye County sheriff.

Media reports, citing unnamed sources, said doctors believe Odom might have suffered an accidental overdose and a stroke.

Court indicts 'Dance Moms' reality star

Reality TV show star **Abby Lee Miller** has been indicted on bankruptcy fraud and other federal charges for concealing income she earned on "Dance Moms" and related spinoff shows, prosecutors said Wednesday.

A federal grand jury returned a 20-count indictment Tuesday against Miller, 50, on charges of bankruptcy fraud,

concealment of bankruptcy assets, and false bankruptcy declarations.

She will be arraigned Nov. 5 in U.S. District Court in Pittsburgh, said a spokeswoman for U.S. Attorney **David Hickton**.

If convicted, Miller faces up to five years in prison and a \$250,000 fine for each count, Hickton said in a press release.

Cooper applauds Lawrence's attack

Actor **Bradley Cooper** applauded his frequent co-star **Jennifer Lawrence** on Wednesday for speaking out about Hollywood's gender pay gap and said it was high time to start fixing the problem.

Cooper, speaking to Reuters at a promotional event for his latest film "Burnt," said it was "fantastic" that Lawrence had taken up the cause and that her popularity gave her a great "platform."

Lawrence won an Oscar for "Silver Linings Playbook" and was named as the world's highest-paid actress last year by Forbes, with an estimated \$52 million in earnings.

She unleashed a no-holds barred attack on the wage gap Tuesday in an essay titled "Why Do I Make Less Than My Co-Stars," for **Lena Dunham's** Lenny newsletter.

It's hard to believe Fred Liang's intricate artwork is, at its most basic, just a few sheets of paper.


Derived from the folk art of jianzhi (paper cut), Liang puts a modern spin on the traditional pieces by creating drawings, installations and sculptures with paper-cut artwork.

Liang's exhibit "A Bubble in a Stream" will be on display Saturday through Dec. 13 in the North Dakota Museum of Art.

"I also tinker with subtle, symbolic implications and metaphors that connect the past and present, East and West, philosophy and religion," Liang said in a press release.

The official exhibit opening begins at 5 p.m. Saturday, followed by a Liang-led gallery talk at 6 and a Grand Forks Master Chorale concert, "Ice, Iron and Stone," at 7:30 p.m.

If you can't make it to the opening, regular gallery hours are from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. weekdays and 1 to 5 p.m. Saturdays and Sundays.
