Parking is reserved during drop off and pick up times only.</p> <p>ALWAYS make sure a camp staff member knows you have dropped off and picked up your camper. Please notify us in advance if someone else is picking up your camper.</p>
Lunches and Snacks:	<p>Each camper must bring their own lunch. Please note: there is no access to refrigeration or heating appliances. Campers cannot be allowed to use vending machines. Snacks will be provided by the Museum once a day, e.g. juice box and serving size bag of chips. We appreciate that some parents offer to supply snacks for the day. If you wish to do so, please let us know a day in advance. ***SEE FOOD ALLERGY INFORMATION BELOW!!!***</p>
Suggestions to pack:	<p>Ask your camper(s) to wear appropriate clothes that can get stained. After all, this is an art making camp and we'll be getting messy. You may wish to consider packing a sweater or light jacket (air conditioning in the building can get really cool), comfortable shoes for standing, walking, and playing outside, hat or sunglasses, and sunscreen. Please mark all items. Leftover items are donated at the end of each camp.</p>
Photography and video:	<p>During the registration process for camp you will be asked to give photo consent. You will not be able to register without providing consent.</p>
Discipline:	<p>We encourage respectful behavior throughout all of the Summer Art Camps. Disrespectful behavior will not be tolerated. If a camper is behaving in a disrespectful manner:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) verbal warning 2) time out 3) visit with Director of Education 4) Call parents and remove from camp for the remainder of the day <p>The Museum reserves the right to remove any camper from camps at any time. Camp fees will not be refunded.</p>

Sharing the Camp Experience:

Please feel free to join your camper at any time during camps.

If we are not in the classroom we may be out to lunch or walking around campus. Lunches usually take place outdoors around 12:30pm. There are times when we will be taking nature walks around campus and visiting the Museum.

Receptions:

On Fridays at 2:00 pm the campers design and hold a brief reception and art show for parents, friends, and family. Park in the same area that you drop them off in the morning. The campers are proud of their week's work. We encourage you to show your support by attending the reception. This is also a time for you to meet the teaching artist, Museum staff, and all the other campers and families that make camps possible. Please prepare to take home the artwork at 3:00 pm, after the reception. You will want to bring your camera.

The Three R's – Please review with your child before camp begins:

Respect for Others:

We will use appropriate voices and language. Hurtful comments about others or their art will not be permitted. Fighting or bullying will not be tolerated.

Respect for the Environment:

For our own safety and for the safety of the art works we will keep from handling things that do not belong to us. In the same way, we will use art materials carefully and for art purposes only. We will not deface grounds or property, or tamper with fire or safety equipment. There will be no capturing or cruelty to animals, which includes bugs. For safety reasons, tree and wall climbing are not allowed.

Respect for Ourselves:

We will stay with the group at all times and in sight of an adult at all times.

Food Allergy Information:

This year we have children attending Summer Art Camps who have allergies to some foods, especially peanuts. Some of these children can have life-threatening reactions from even touching these foods.

As you know, the camp environment is not like a public classroom where children eat in a controlled environment such as a cafeteria. I am requesting that all parents pack lunches for your child that do not contain peanuts or peanut butter. Often, items such as cookies and crackers will have a warning that they were processed in a plant where peanut products were also processed. Some foods use peanut oil in the processing as well. So when you are buying products for this week please try to avoid peanut products. I will provide snacks each day, such as fruit packs and juice.

All parents are responsible to send lunches and beverages with their children.

If your own child has allergies we should be aware of, please fill that out on our medical form that is available on the first day of camp. If you have a concern that the daily snack we provide might not be safe for your child, please provide your own snack.

Please also review with your child how important it is, because of these allergies, to comply when camp helpers ask all children to wash their hands well before and after eating.

Thank you for helping make this camp experience fun for all children.
